DISTINGUISHED MOOSE BIOLOGIST

An award was established by the North American Moose Conference and Workshop in 1981 to honor, and bring to the public's attention, the outstanding contribution of a particular individual, individuals and/or organizations to moose management. Nominations are made to the Distinguished Moose Biologist Committee by anyone. The Committee passes on the suitability of nominees, and, if an award is appropriate, it is presented at the next Conference/Workshop.

In 1989, the Distinguished Moose Biologist Award was presented to Warren Ballard.

Warren's career has spanned 17 years with the Alaska Department of Fish and Game with responsibilities varying from an Area Game Biologist to his present position of Research Game Biologist at Nome. His contributions are many including presentation of numerous papers at moose conferences and subsequent publication, reviewing of papers and active participation in discussions directed at enhancing the international image of the North American Moose Conference and Alces. Noteworthy are his contributions in the field of moose/predator relationships and his ability to examine entire systems and relate the assorted components.


